When should my child All children MUST attend school unless they are ill. stay at home? COVID-19 testing (either routine or symptomatic) is no longer indicated except in very particular situations (hospitals etc). There is no access to free testing for most people. Children and young people with mild symptoms of respiratory infection, such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education or childcare setting. Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people. They can return to the setting when they no longer have a high temperature and they feel well enough. Anyone who does test positive with a lateral flow test-should stay at home for 5 days (adults) or 3 days (children).
